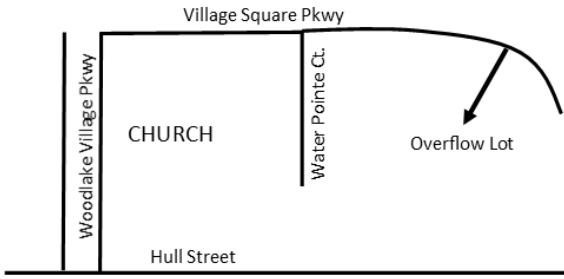

PRAYER OF PETITION

Metro Richmond at Prayer—We pray for persons in financial need in Metropolitan Richmond: For healthy marriages; for constructive, safe, and caring households for the bringing up and nurturing of children and caring for the elderly.

From 1 Timothy 2:1-2: I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.

SRPC Supported Missions: Barbara Campbell, MNA SecondCareer Ministry— Give praise for an increasing number of volunteers, with PCA church planters. Pray for their safety, encouragement, and a healthier ministry account from donors. Pray that the Lord will supply more "on site" volunteers, as many church plants need volunteers to help with needs that can only be done in person.

The Persecuted Church—Local party officials in south-east China are “encouraging” Christians to replace Christian posters with portraits of the Chinese President in their homes, as part of campaign to secularize the region. At a meeting last month, Communist Party leaders in Yugan county described the presence of religion as a “crisis.” One resident told journalists that poor Christian families who were open about their faith faced cuts in government aid: “Some families put up gospel couplets on their front doors during the Lunar New Year; some also hung paintings of the cross. But they’ve all been torn down,” he said. “They all have their belief and, of course, they didn’t want to take them down. But there is no way out. If they don’t agree to do so, they won’t be given their quota from the poverty-relief fund.”
