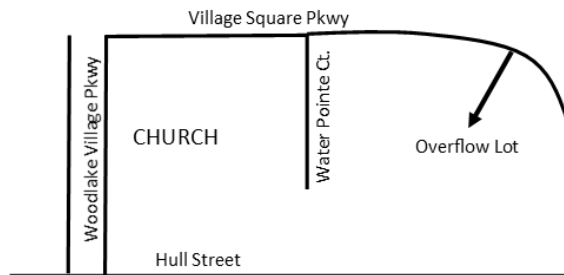

PRAYER OF PETITION

Metro Richmond at Prayer—We pray to overcome in Christ's name the heritage of racism: To overcome ignorance, indifference, resentment, and bitterness with regard to race in both private and public life.

From 1 Timothy 2:1-2: I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.

SRPC Supported Missions: International Partnerships—Pray for pastor Sergey, his wife Luda, and their 3 children in Kharkiv, Ukraine. They and their little church are very busy, with three English and Bible groups, two home Bible studies, a Bible study for the people displaced from the war zone, and a Bible class at the boarding school for kids from dysfunctional and poor families. They have also been making regular trips to the war zone trips, visiting soldiers and civilians at the frontline positions. Please pray for additional volunteers in their church, for work-life balance, and for fruit in these ministries.

The Persecuted Church—Pray for religious freedom in Bolivia, where a new law will bracket criminal groups with religious organizations. The law bans people trying to 'recruit' others to take part in 'armed conflicts or religious or worship organizations'. This could mean that simply inviting someone to a Christian event could count as an offense. Evangelical representatives are warning it could mean the end of religious freedom in the country.

GIVING OF TITHES AND OFFERINGS

Oh To Be Loved By Jesus

Giving of tithes and offerings is a tangible demonstration we trust in God's provision instead of our perceived self-sufficiency. It loosens our grip on greed so we live open-handedly and generously with the resources God has given us. I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich." (2 Corinthians 8:7-9)
